Winnefox Library System works collaboratively with three other library systems to provide continuing education regionally. This collaboration is called NEWI and in 2024 NEWI restarted Trustee Training, as well as maintaining excellent member library workshop opportunities. Additionally, Winnefox provides accounting services to four other library systems in the state. Finally, Winnefox has maintained a contractual service agreement with Oshkosh Public Library since the system's inception. This collaboration provides administration support to Oshkosh and Winnefox pays for database and catalogue support from Oshkosh. Winnefox also have representation on WPLC, the statewide Marketing Cohort, participates in the Youth and Inclusive service statewide meetings, and works collaboratively on workforce development.

- (m) Planning with the division and with participating public libraries and other types of libraries in the area in regard to the library technology and the sharing of resources. By January 1, 2000, and every 5th January thereafter, the public library system shall submit to the division a written plan for library technology and the sharing of resources.
- (n) That, if the system reimburses a participating public library for the costs of providing interlibrary borrowing services to an individual who holds a valid borrower's card of another participating public library, the reimbursement shall not exceed the actual costs incurred by the public library in providing such services. The department shall promulgate rules defining "actual costs" for the purposes of this paragraph.
