Library Summer Reading Programs: Build A Better World! is the slogan for this year's summer reading programs. Many libraries now have programs for teens and adults, as well as the traditional children's programs. Libraries put a lot of effort into their summer programs both because it increases library use and because it's good for the children. Research shows that children who participate in a public library reading program over the summer start the school year ahead of those who don't. Studies have shown that failure to read well by the end of third grade is linked to higher dropout rates. Winnefox supports our libraries by:

- Organizing group purchases of materials
- Printing reading records and promotional materials
- Assisting with bookings of performers
