- "The division shall issue certificates to public librarians and promulgate, under ch. 227, necessary standards for public librarians. The qualifications for public librarians shall be based on education, professional training and experience."
- Public librarian certification requirements and grades are defined in Chapter PI 6 of the Administrative Code

PUBLIC CONSTRUCTION

Library Ed Requirements for Grades II and III

- 12 semester credits in the following areas:
 - Basic public library administration
 - Advanced public library administration
 - Organization and management of collections
 - Public and community services

OR -

• Bachelor's degree with a minor in Library Science and Advanced public library administration course



Temporary Certification

- Provides for Grade I directors to be hired before graduation
- Provides for Grade II and III directors to be hired and then complete required courses within an allotted timeframe



Continuing Education

- Once regular certification is obtained, 100 hours of CE must be compiled and documented in the 5 year period prior to recertification for all three grades
- At least 10 hours of the 100 must be technology-related training
- Details for certification are codified in Administrative Code PI 6 and explained in the Certification Manual



Options for CE Activities

- Category A
 - Academic courses
 - Approved credit equivalency courses
- Category B
 - Workshops, seminars, institutes
 - Lecture series
 - Technology Training
 - State or national library conferences
 - Audited courses
- Category C
 - Pre-approved self-directed activities

- At least 70 contact hours must be earned in Categories A & B
- Public library systems play a major role in continuing education and certification
